The **REVIEW** is a bi-monthly journal devoted to the interests of the philosophical sciences: Logic, Psychology, Ethics, Aesthetics, Metaphysics, and the Philosophy of Religion. It has now completed its eleventh year, and is recognized both at home and abroad as the representative philosophical journal of America. The terms of its endowment require that it shall be an absolutely free organ of contemporary philosophy.

The **REVIEW** usually contains 112 pages. About one-half of the space of each number is given to **original articles** and **discussions**. The remainder includes carefully prepared **critical reviews** of the most important books, **classified summaries** of articles appearing in the leading American and European philosophical magazines, prompt and trustworthy accounts of the contents and character of **new books**, and **notes** of general interest regarding philosophers and the progress of philosophy. Special attention is directed to the **classified summaries** which enable a reader of the **REVIEW** to learn, at a minimum of trouble, labor, and expense, what results and conclusions, bearing on the subject in which he is specially interested, are appearing from time to time in the other philosophical periodicals.

Authors of newly published philosophical works are requested to send a brief account of their scope and content for publication.
